At least 80% of our garments will be Conscious by the end of 2022.

Recycled Polyester 50% of our polyester styles will be made with recycled polyester by the end of 2022 Cellulose 70% of our cellulose fibres will be from a sustainable source by the end of 2022 Vegan 100% of our faux leather will be vegan by the end 2022

What is Conscious?

Our products are 'Conscious' if they contain at least 30% responsible materials or are produced with responsible processes.

All Ever New items which are labelled as 'Conscious' must be either:

- Certified against independent, third-party verified standards, traceable from origin to final product; or
- Crafted with a more responsible process compared to traditional methods

We define a more responsible material and process as one which results in an improved environmental and/or social sustainable outcome in comparison to conventional production processes.

How to shop Conscious?

Responsible Materials

Ever New makes a conscious decision to use global, verified third-party standards. Certified standards can assist to verify environmental, chemical, and social practices down to the raw material stage.

We have identified our most used fibres and materials and have found more responsible options. Here are some of our preferred responsible fibres and materials you can currently find in our products:







Recycled Polyester

Recycled polyester is derived from existing material such as plastic bottles and textile waste. Recycled polyester helps reduce and divert waste that could end up in our oceans and landfill. Ever New purchase recycled materials from suppliers certified through the Global Recycled Standard



Sustainable Cotton

Sustainable cotton is cotton that is grown and/or produced in a way that reduces the environmental impact compared to the conventional process. Ever New is a proud member of **Better Cotton™**. Better Cotton's mission is to help cotton communities survive and thrive, while protecting and restoring the environment. Better Cotton trains farmers to use water efficiently, care for soil health and natural habitats, reduce the use of the most harmful chemicals and respect workers' rights and wellbeing.



Responsible Viscose

Responsible viscose is fibres sourced through independent third-party organisations. This means the raw material is sourced from controlled and sustainable forests. This means the raw materials does not come from ancient or endangered forest and does not contribute to illegal logging. Ever New use LENZINGTM ECOVEROTM, Livaeco by Birla CelluloseTM and FSC Viscose among others. These branded viscose fibres also meet high environmental standards from sourcing to production.



Animal Friendly

Animal friendly products are product that are completely free of animal products, by-products or derivatives. Ever New are members of **The Vegan Society** and all our animal friendly products are registered with the Vegan Society.

Progress on Targets

Currently, 72% of our clothing range is made using sustainable fibres or processes.

By the end of 2022, that number will be 80%

Cotton

83%* of our cotton garments were made with more sustainable cotton.



Recycled Polyester 53%* of our polyester garments were made with recycled polyester.



Cellulose

60%* of our cellulose garments were made with fibres sourced from sustainable alternatives.



Vegan

Our entire footwear, handbags and belt range is vegan.

Product Stewardship

We want to celebrate the effort and progress we have made using more responsible fibres and materials, but also understand that our products have an environmental impact throughout the whole life cycle.

Responsible product stewardship is important to Ever New and for us this means to manage the environmental impact of a product or material throughout the life cycle, including 'end of life'.

We have internal guidelines and policies to ensure we forecast and plan for demand to avoid over-production. If a product doesn't sell, we carry this over into the new season or sell it in a different market. We also hold public warehouse sales and donate clothing to charities such as Red Cross and Thread Together.

End-of-life

Items we are unable to donate or sell such as design samples, faulty returns and trims are recycled through our partnership with Upparel or donated to the Reverse Art Truck, a Melbourne-based reuse program.

Wash and care

Washing and caring for your clothing can increase its lifespan considerably, meaning your favourite pieces stay in your wardrobe for longer. Caring for your clothing in a Conscious way can include using less water and energy in the laundering process. These practices can help to reduce your impact on the environment and the climate.
